Shortly after the launch of the second ReadOKC *On the Go!* Book Bus last September, students across the district were invited to submit name suggestions for the two buses based on their favorite book characters. The finalists were then voted on by the OKC community.

On Monday, January 29, the students at Classen SAS Middle School helped the Foundation celebrate the unveiling of the winning names: Percy and Stella, inspired by the characters from *Percy Jackson and the Olympians* and *Stella's Stellar Hair*. "Our ReadOKC *On the Go! Book Buses* provide critical reading materials, help improve literacy rates and promote a life-long love of reading among students across our district," said Mary Mélon-Tully, President and CEO of the Oklahoma City Public Schools Foundation. "Naming these book buses furthers the impact they have on and strengthens the connection they have to our schools and our city as a whole. We can't wait to see how Percy and Stella continue to positively impact students in the years to come."

Read Across OKCPS



ReadOKC partnered with OKCPS for the inaugural Read Across OKCPS event on Friday, March 8, to host a district-wide event centered around the celebration of literacy. Thanks to generous donors, all pre-K and Kindergarten students received a free book. Over 500 were copies of the Dr. Seuss classic *Green Eggs and Ham*, distributed by the Foundation. During the event, 185 community volunteers and OKCPS administrators visited elementary schools to share their love of reading through story time. Elementary, middle, and high Schools held a variety of literacy activities including Drop Everything and Read (D.E.A.R.) time, Book Tastings, Create-Your-Own Bookmarks, scavenger hunts and more! Volunteers agree that they got just as much out of the experience as the students did. We can't wait for next year!
